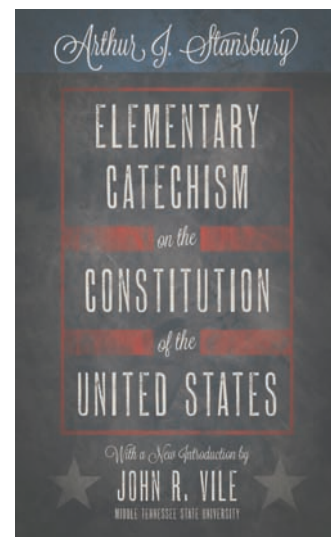

Recognition of the U.S. Constitution's importance increased dramatically in 1826 due to the deaths of John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the election of President Andrew Jackson and the jubilee celebration of the Declaration of Independence. At this time, a period when public schools were increasing in number, educators responded with coursework that promoted the virtues of the Constitution to the nation's youth. Arthur J. Stansbury, a Presbyterian minister known for his political speeches, wrote one of the most popular textbooks used in the schools. Cast in the form of questions and answers in a chronological explanation of the Constitution, his "catechism" endowed patriotism with moral virtues in his depiction of the nation's "highly favored" birth-right.

ARTHUR J. STANSBURY [1781–1865], a New York Presbyterian minister, often preached on political topics and was known for the patriotic fervor to his addresses. His other publications were addresses and sermons, reports of debates in Congress and trial records of judges and clergymen. He also illustrated children's books, including *The Children's Friend* (1821), a book about Christmas that included an early depiction of Santa Claus.

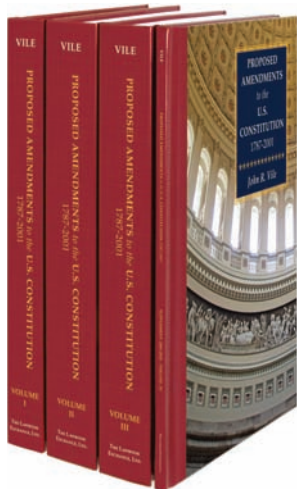

27 amendments to the U.S. Constitution were ratified between 1787 and 1992. At the same time members of Congress proposed 11,500 amendments; states have filed close to 400 additional petitions for constitutional conventions to propose amendments.

These four volumes edited and introduced by John R. Vile collect and update compilations of lists of proposed amendments and convention petitions that have been scattered about in a variety of governmental reports. They also reprint classic studies by Herman Ames and Michael Musmanno that analyzed amending proposals introduced during the nation's early years. The work includes texts of basic constitutional documents like the Articles of Confederation, the U.S. Constitution and its amendments, and the Confederate Constitution, as well as a comprehensive index of all amendments proposed through 2001. The fourth volume comprises a supplement to the earlier three, and brings the amendments up through 2010.

DR. JOHN R. VILE (Ph.D., University of Virginia) is a Professor of Political Science and Dean of the University Honors College at Middle Tennessee State University. He has written and edited six previous books on the constitutional amending process including the award-winning *Encyclopedia of Constitutional Amendments, Proposed Amendments, and Amending Issues: 1789-2010*, now in its third edition.

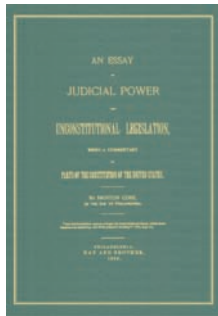
THOMAS MCINTYRE COOLEY [1824–1898] was a justice of the Michigan Supreme Court and was appointed by President Grover Cleveland to serve on the Interstate Commerce Commission. He was a visiting professor at Johns Hopkins University and dean of the University of Michigan Law School. First issued in 1870, his edition of Blackstone, popularly known as “Cooley’s Blackstone,” was the standard American edition of the late nineteenth century (see p. 73). Thomas M. Cooley Law School in Lansing, Michigan, founded in 1972, was named in his honor.

The views of Hamilton, Madison and Jay expressed in this landmark work have had a lasting effect on U.S. Constitutional law. Eighty-five of the essays were almost entirely written by Hamilton and Madison, and probably only five were written by Jay. Most of the individual essays appeared under the collective pseudonym "Publius" in New York newspapers and journals from October 27, 1787 to early June 1788. The first edition was published anonymously and printed by the M'Lean brothers, who collected and published the first 36 essays as Volume I in March, 1788, with the final 49 essays in Volume II in May of the same year, along with the text of the Constitution. The essays were intended to encourage ratification of the proposed constitution by New York State, but were immediately recognized as the most compelling commentary on the most radical form of government the world had seen. Hamilton's essays especially express a strong concern for the rights of property over the natural rights of "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness," as outlined by Jefferson in the Declaration of Independence.

ALEXANDER HAMILTON [1757–1804] was a member of the Philadelphia Constitutional Convention in 1787 and later became the first Secretary of the Treasury under President Washington.

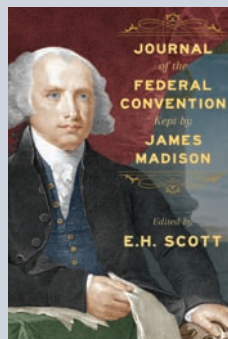
JAMES MADISON [1751–1836] was the fourth President of the United States. He was often referred to as the “father of the Constitution” because of his influential writings in *The Federalist* and his leading participation in the Constitutional Convention.

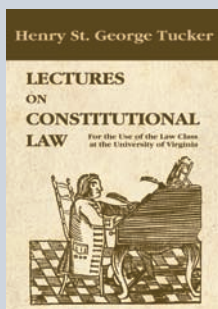
JOHN TAYLOR [1753–1824] was known as “John Taylor of Caroline County, Virginia” and served in the Continental Army and later in the Virginia House of Delegates, then served three separate terms as member of the United States Senate. He is considered to be one of the nation’s greatest philosophers of agrarian liberalism, and wrote extensively on this topic as well as on political matters. One of the nation’s first proponents of states rights, in 1798 he introduced into the Virginia legislature resolutions in support of the doctrine of delegated powers and the right of states to respond to confrontations by other powers.
